


Typical 15- to 23-year-old 2,767 hours


Taking in spiritual content



Typical 15- to 23-year-old 153 hours




Typical 15- to 23-year-old churchgoer 291 hours





How We Defined Resilient Disciples

Christ followers who:

- (1) attend church at least monthly and engage with their church more than just attending worship services;
- (2) trust firmly in the authority of the Bible;
- (3) are committed to Jesus personally and affirm he was crucified and raised from the dead to conquer sin and death; and
- (4) express desire to transform the broader society as an outcome of their faith.




Cultural Discernment



% who agree strongly with each statement






Habits Matter: Resilient Disciples Digest Nearly Double the Hours of Christian Content Annually

Resilient disciples	562 hours





Meaningful relationships means being devoted to fellow believers we want to be around and become.







Vocational discipleship means knowing and living God's calling, especially in the arena of work, and right-sizing our ambitions to God's purposes.







Three Ways God Designed Work for Good





Participating in <u>countercultural mission</u> means serving as a faithful presence by trusting in God's power and living differently from cultural norms.








