



PROPORTION OF EACH AGE GROUP THAT IDENTIFIES AS CHRISTIAN














MOST UK ADULTS SEE SOME ROLE FOR THE CHURCH



























WHAT'S THE IDEAL BALANCE BETWEEN GLOBAL AND LOCAL MISSION?






WHERE UK CHURCHES FOCUS ON SUPPORTING




When it comes to financial donations or volunteering for a cause, which three of the following social issues do you consider to be most important for you / your church to support?




How involved would you say your church is in each of the following social issues?



AT A GLANCE

SIX IN 10 CHURCH LEADERS (60%) FEEL THAT APPROACHING SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EVANGELISM IN TANDEM WILL BE THE WAY FORWARD.

UK CHURCH LEADERS LOOK FIRST TO GOVERNMENTS, CHARITIES OR LAYPEOPLE TO ADDRESS MOST SOCIAL JUSTICE CONCERNS.










IS IT APPROPRIATE FOR A CHRISTIAN CHARITY TO WORK IN THE SECULAR SECTOR?












LACK OF PUBLIC CONFIDENCE IN UK CHURCHES



If a Christian church organised an activity or campaign on any of the following issues, which, if any, would you be willing to support?






If a Christian church organised an activity or campaign on any of the following issues, which, if any, would you be willing to support?

METHODOLOGY

THIS STUDY INVOLVED QUANTITATIVE SURVEYS WITH BRITISH ADULTS, CHURCH LEADERS AND ACTIVE CHRISTIANS.

BARNA INTERVIEWED 302 CHURCH LEADERS FOR THIS STUDY.

- Online survey conducted from 6 April 2017 to 9 May 2017
- Phone survey conducted 28 April 2017 to 9 May 2017

BARNA ALSO SURVEYED:

- 2,054 British adults (18 and older, representative of the general population)
- 1,170 active Christians (a panel recruited primarily from Christian media sources)
 - Two separate shared polls online (both hosted by ComRes) from 6 April 2017 to 11 April 2017.

GLOSSARY

UK / BRITISH ADULT: a person over 18 who lives in the UK (this particular panel did not include those who live in Northern Ireland)

CHURCH LEADER: a UK adult who confirms that they currently lead a church or congregation in the UK

ACTIVE CHRISTIAN: a UK adult who actively engages in a minimum of monthly churchgoing, Bible reading and prayer

Non-Christian: a UK adult who identifies with a religion other than Christian (selected Muslim, Hindu, Jewish, Sikh, Buddhist, other, none or declined to answer)
